One of six four-year comprehensive public high schools in Township High School District 214. Located in the northwest suburbs, Rolling Meadows High School (RMHS) is 30 miles northwest of downtown Chicago, Illinois. The school community is primarily middle income and residential. RMHS serves the southwestern portion of District 214, which includes Rolling Meadows and portions of Arlington Heights and Mt. Prospect. There are 152 licensed staff members (20 B.A., 132 M.A.). 2013-2014 operating expense per pupil was \$19,733.62.

DISTRICT 214 POLICIES

District 214 has eliminated the reporting of class rank. Class rank is no longer available on transcripts.

District 214 schools do not post ACT or SAT scores with transcripts.
